## RETURN YOUR APPLICATION

### STEP ONE

Once you have completed the housing application, double-check the contents of your application and make sure it is filled out completely. Remember, if you are making a specific roommate request, your hall preferences AND room types MUST match that of your roommate. We encourage you to keep copies of all documents and checks or money orders for your records.

### STEP TWO

Return the housing application in the envelope provided. Enclose a \$30 nonrefundable application fee made payable to "University of Oregon." Only checks and money orders in U.S. funds from U.S. or international banks will be accepted. (All applications sent without the \$30 nonrefundable application fee will be returned.)

### STEP THREE

Wait to receive your confirmation postcard. If you don't receive your confirmation postcard within two weeks of sending off your application packet, please call us at (541) 346-4277 to make sure we received your application.

### STEP FOUR

Return all subsequent documents, which will be mailed to you after April 1, 2010.
